The 2015 school year will be ending in October and it's been another busy season.

In August, we held our Parent's Night. The student worship team performed for the parents and I had the privilege to sing with them. Later, we distributed student grades to the parents as they visited the classrooms. I enjoy it when I have the opportunity to speak with each of the parents and share the successes of their children.
