



* Merry Christmas

The staff's commitment to our students was key to achieving our goals, since the students, in addition to receiving their virtual classes, continued to also receive their devotional time once a week. Thanks to the donations we received from our supporters, we were able to visit some families who lost their jobs as a result of the pandemic and we were able to deliver bags of groceries to each of them. We also supported families who suffered directly from the virus.

As for my work at the University on Saturdays, God has allowed me to continue teaching my students online and, on many occasions, to be able to encourage them to keep moving forward. Because of this, I have had the opportunity to not only teach classes, but also share experiences of God's faithfulness in my life.







On October 2, I had the opportunity to share the topic "The Importance of Values in Education" which was organized by the Chiloé Foundation in the country of Chile, where teachers from different Latin American countries participated. I was also able to share the topic "The Importance of Values in the Work Environment" with a commissariat of the PNC (National Civil Police) of Guatemala with whom I will continue to do on a monthly basis.
